DEMONSTRATOR: Mike Peace

FEBRUARY MEETING

DEMONSTRATOR: Wes Jones

DEMONSTRATION: The February 14th meeting of Chattahoochee Wood Turners welcomed member Wes Jones as the demonstrator. Wes chose to show his method of turning a deep hollow form.

Wes began the demo with an explanation of how to center his dry, roughed cherry bowl on the lathe. The bowl was previously turned while green. The first step was to mount a faceplate on the lathe. The rim of the bowl was then centered as well as possible on the faceplate and the live center was placed in the dimple that was left on the tenon from the roughing out process when the bowl was green.

He then began to cut the bottom of the bowl, using slicing cuts with a large bowl gouge with a swept back profile. Wes emphasized making light cuts with sharp tools to minimize tear out. After the cuts were all made and the profile was what Wes had designed for the bowl, he then used a John Jordan shear scrape to remove lines left by the gouge. The outside was then ready for sanding. Wes then re-cut the tenon with a bedan and prepared to mount to the chuck's jaws.

Wes indicated that the inside of the bowls should be worked from the rim at about 1" inch at a time, using calipers to keep thickness consistent. He showed members how a figure 8 caliper could be shop-made of plywood very inexpensively. Once the sides of the bowl were of the desired thickness and smooth, the fingernail bowl gouge is no longer effective for the deeper recesses of the bowl's bottom. Wes used a bowl gouge with a 60-65 degree bevel to access the bottom of the bowl. This grind allowed the tool to remove the remaining wood from inside the bowl bottom while retaining bevel contact. He then used a negative rake scraper to remove the small imperfections left by the gouge.

Wes concluded the demo by answering questions from the members.
