# **DEMONSTRATOR:** Wes Jones

Wes Jones lives in Lawrenceville, Georgia and has been a lifelong woodturner and woodworker. Wes retired in 2001 after a 31 year career as a fiber optic apparatus design engineer with Lucent Technologies and Bell Laboratories. He now works full-time as a woodturning artist specializing in large decorative pieces, such as bowls, hollowforms, and vases. He is most well known for his large hollowform creations made from native trees. His pieces can be found in private collections throughout the country and the world. His work has been displayed at the Reinhardt College Museum of Art, the Georgia National Fair, the John C. Campbell Folk School, the Douglasville Art Center, the Perry Art Center, and at various art shows and woodturning symposiums. He has received over 40 awards for his work. His work is available in a number of fine art galleries in Georgia.

Wes is very active in promoting the development of woodturning art and furthering woodturning education. Wes is a frequent woodturning demonstrator at various woodturning clubs and commercial venues. He periodically teaches woodturning courses at the John C. Campbell Folk School in Brasstown, North Carolina as well as giving private woodturning instruction at his studio.

Wes has demonstrated at the Turning Southern Style woodturning symposium and the Southern States woodturning Symposium. He has published a number of articles in the *American Woodturner* and *Woodturning Design* magazines. Wes was the 2016 Woodturning Artist in Residence at the Georgia National Fair.

Wes is a member of the American Association of Woodturners and is very active in three of the AAW chapters in Georgia. He is a past President of the Georgia Association of Woodturners in Atlanta and also of the Chattahoochee Woodturners in Gainesville, GA. He is a past Vice-President of the Peach State Woodturners in Oxford, Georgia.

# **JANUARY MEETING**

#### **DEMONSTRATOR:** Harvey Meyer

**<u>DEMONSTRATION:</u>** The January 10, 2017 meeting of the Chattahoochee Wood Turners had a demonstration of lidded boxes by Harvey Meyer. Harvey showed various tips on making a successful lidded box. He began with a 3 X 3 square blank about 4 inches long, on which he cuts off the lid on the bandsaw rather than the lathe in order to keep the kerf at a minimum. This saves wood at the cut to maintain grain pattern.

Harvey then proceeded to rough cut the blanks between centers using a spindle roughing gouge, then cut tenons on each of the ends for the chuck. He mounted the lid first and completed the inside of the lid. He then chucked the bottom of the box and hollowed the inside making sure the the lid and body fit to his satisfaction. The outside of the lid was finished at this point, as well as finish cuts on the entire box and the parted off. Harvey suggested use of Minwax antique oil for the finish, because it did not affect the diameter of the fit of lid and body. The finished box was donated to the club for auction.

It was a very well executed demo and Harvey is an entertaining turner to watch and learn from.
