September 2009 Demo

Jim Talley from Athens, GA : Miniatures and other Small Stuff. Jim is a former president of Chattahoochee Woodturners and is well know for the very small objects he turns on the lathe. Come see how it's done.

August Meeting Recap:

DEMO: Mark Gardner, a Wood Artist from Saluda, North Carolina was our Double Header demonstrator for August. Mark has taught at JC Campbell Folk School and at Arrowmont.



First, Mark turned a hollow form the easy way. Instead of hollowing the vessel through a tiny hole, he basically turned it like a lidded container and then glued the lid on. Not only is it easier to hollow out a vessel this way it is easier to clean out the shavings as well as gauge the thickness of the walls.



Here is a picture of the vessel he typically makes. He generally recommends putting the seam at the widest diameter. He uses Medium CA as yellow

glue does not work well with green wood. Here is a picture of the vessel he typically He uses green wood for this but lets it dry before carving the handles. He strives for a uniform wall thickness of ¼" – 3/8" plus or minus a 1/16". With this type of vessel he sometimes puts the seam just below the handles.

In his second demonstration, Mark illustrated his own take on the idea of a square bowl. He generally uses dry wood for this with two or more pieces glued together. His roughing out process produces two bowl blanks. He used three different axis to turn this bowl, and at one point, held the bowl on the lathe using 2x4s, hot glue and drywall screws.



This demo helped to illustrate his approach to turning and the use of the lathe as a tool for shaping wood, not just for making it round. You can see more of his work at www.markgardnerstudio.com. *Write-up and pictures by Mike Peace*

Next Year's Saturday Turning Days

From Bob Black: I'm beginning to think about what to do for next year. I'm asking for your help.

What would you like to do? What would you like to learn? What would you like to review?

I'm thinking about a 2 to 3 month beginner class. A better name would probably be a skill building class. Too often, I suspect we plan classes around a specific object. This presents a certain amount of pressure to produce the object during the class. I'm thinking about doing just the opposite.

That would be a series of turning Saturdays where nothing would be made but shavings. Maybe one day on spindles during which we would turn spindles from big to small to nothing – how thin can you go before it breaks. Or how many times can you cut a series of beads, cut them off and then do it again. The next month maybe take bowl blanks and turn them to nothing first making the outside cut, and then taking the next blank and hollowing it to nothing. Let me know what you would like.
