April Meeting Demonstration

Demonstrator: Throughout his life, Steve has been drawn to work with wood. In 2000, he found woodturning and he has become addicted to it as a medium for expression. He feels that, like everything in nature, each piece of wood has its own character. Each piece is much like every other piece of that species, but each also has its own personality and appeal. He finds few things in life more enjoyable and satisfying than seeing that personality emerge from a large wet lump of wood and doing his best to bring out its beauty and character.

Until his retirement in 2007, his turning was limited to evenings and weekends, but since retiring, he spends as much time as possible in his shop producing craft show items, which help pay for his addiction, as well as artistic pieces. After making his share of pens, bowls, boxes and weed pots, his primary interest has focused in the exploration of three areas; hollow forms, carving/piercing, and coloring. He particularly enjoys taking a bland piece and transforming it into something much more than it might have achieved on its own.

Steve's work has been included in art galleries and numerous juried shows throughout the area

Demonstration: Steve's demonstration covered coloring and texturing as it applies to bowls and platters. Steve showed us techniques for developing design ideas and methods for applying them to a three dimensional surface. He expanded on those ideas by exploring ways to enhance these designs using various texturing and coloring techniques. He also covered methods for using rotary carvers, pyrography, lesser known types of acrylic paints milk paint and more



May Meeting Demonstration

Demonstrator: Frank Bowers:

I am a full time woodturning instructor and demonstrator. From an early age I have worked making things from wood along with numerous remodeling projects but never introduced to woodturning. After moving to Georgia I had an opportunity to see a wooden pen demonstration and was hooked on turning. From that point I took lessons from noted turners in Atlanta and professional turners from around the world who came through the area.

I enjoy using the lathe to transform recycled woods into useful items and artistic objects. The thing I like most about woodturning is the instant gratification; you can spend an hour or two and complete a project, as opposed to regular woodworking where months later you're still working on that weekend project.

Over the past 15 to 20 years I have taught over 800 classes of 6 to 8 students and an untold number of individual one day sessions. I enjoy teaching and demonstrating almost as much as turning it itself. My goal is to keep learning and pass this knowledge on to others.

Demonstration: He will be turning and embellishing platters with an emphasis on design and function. Frank is a great turner and a lot of fun to watch do a demo.

Basic Bowl Turning Workshop

Wed, June 4, 2014

Sponsored by Chattahoochee Woodturners, AAW Chapter 112



Frank Bowers is a very experienced woodturner and noted woodturning trainer who demonstrates throughout the Southeast.

This workshop is suitable for novice and intermediate turners. There are no prerequisites but recent turning experience would be helpful.

In this workshop Frank will start with a log and show how to cut out the blank for a regular and a natural edge bowl.



Frank will teach you how to sharpen and use a bowl gouge to complete two separate bowl projects. First you will rough turn a bowl from green wood. He will explain how you can successfully dry this rough turned green bowl. You will then be able to take it home to dry and finish turn on your own. For the second bowl project, participants will learn how to safely mount a dry blank on their lathe and then turn the bowl to completion and finish it during the workshop. Blanks for these two separate projects will be provided.
