October Meeting Demonstration

Demonstrator: Mark Gardner

Demonstration:

Mark Gardener is a young, energetic, professional turner that gave a very interesting demonstration. He basically takes the work out of hollowing through a small hole by first shaping the exterior of the form and then dividing it at the thickest part making two sections. He hollows the two sections, makes the joints like you would a box, and then glues them together with medium CA. He leaves a thick section which is later used for carving out handles.

In his hands-on class the next day we all had fun doing the "easy" hollowing, joining the sections and learning the process of carving the handles, laying out, texturing using an engraver, and then coloring and finishing the piece.

Mark is a great instructor and very patient with some of us with short memories. "Now how did you say we do that?" was a common question.



November Meeting Demonstration

Demonstrator: Peggy Schmid

Woodturning has become a passion of the former fine arts sculptor and artist. These days she spends her time in her studio creating unique works of woodturned art from the wonderful species available in the area as well as from exotic hardwoods of special character.

Her works include a wide range of ideas from simple bowls to designer art pieces. Most people recognize her for her platters with the carved and metal painted texturing. Rim enhancements are a trademark of the artist. Hollow forms are also one of the many favorite subjects. She has perfected finishing with cynoacrylate or better known as CA glue and achieves a highly polished and durable finish on larger pieces. This finishing technique has been used widely on smaller objects such as wooden pens for many years but few have been able to master the technique on a larger surface.

Peggy is alum of The Atlanta College of Art (Now SCAD) and was an Honors Student at Georgia State University where she studied to become an Art Educator. Her credits as a sculptor include work on the movie "Freejack" staring Emelio Estavez and Mick Jaggar as well as having been the creator of the Pinwheel Project at Tula in Buckhead. She has received numerous awards of excellence both in fine arts and as a woodturner.

Her works are in private and corporate collections throughout the country.

Demonstration:

Each year I begin the quest to develop a new and interesting Christmas Ornament that is a unique design which incorporates woodturning and my abilities as an artist. Several years ago in this quest, I experimented with Eggs. I discovered many interesting things about the egg and about the best techniques for procuring the right eggs, getting the liquid out, attaching a finial, and for making the painted design permanent. I also developed my own method of attaching a finial with a dowel rod to secure the egg. I use artist oil paints to create a Christmas scene or a festive design making each finished egg ornament a collectors' item. You will be able to use my finial technique to create a variety of ornaments using anything from pine cones to corn cobs as the center piece.

I've started turning about 10 years ago, and use a Powermatic 3520B. My son and I race RC Cars, and we enjoy wake surfing and wakeboarding.

My deployment to Iraq was extremely difficult and my shrink suggested that I pick up a hobby to keep my mind occupied when I was not on duty, so I decided to learn to crochet. During my deployment to Afghanistan I continued crocheting but decided that I wanted to do more than scarves and hats so I taught myself to knit.

I am currently in the process of building my shop. My shop will be about 160 square feet and it will have a 12' ceiling. Since I haven't had a shop in about 7 years I have to buy almost all new tools. My favorite individual pieces were the potpourri boxes I've turned, and gave them as gifts to my family. They all still have them and they all still look great. My advice for a new turner will be to wear a dust mask and a face shield.
